INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING BOAT STICKER APPLICATIONS

Directions for obtaining new Dunlap Lake Boat Stickers:

1. Obtain one Application/Registration form for each boat requiring new Boat Stickers. Forms are available on Dunlap Lake's Website, www.dunlaplake.org.
2. Complete form with all requested information.
3. Make check (\$10.00 per watercraft) payable to: Dunlap Lake Property Owners Association, or DLPOA.
4. Mail completed application with a copy of the Illinois registration and check to: Dunlap Lake Property Owners Association, P.O. Box # 5, Edwardsville, IL 62025. If Illinois registration has not been received attach copy of Illinois application and mail copy of registration when received
5. Upon receipt of properly completed application with required attachments, Boat Stickers will be mailed to the property owner's address of record.
6. Allow fifteen (15) days for processing and mailing. Contact Carolyn@dunlaplake.org with any questions or delays in receiving the stickers.

Directions for transferring Dunlap Lake Boat Stickers:

1. Obtain one Application/Registration form per boat requiring transfer of Boat Stickers. Forms are available on Dunlap Lake's Website, www.dunlaplake.org.
2. Complete form with all requested information.
3. Make check (\$5.00 per watercraft) payable to: Dunlap Lake Property Owners Association, or DLPOA.
4. Mail completed application with a copy of the Illinois registration and check to: Dunlap Lake Property Owners Association, P.O. Box # 5, Edwardsville, IL 62025. If Illinois registration has not been received attach copy of Illinois application and mail copy of registration when received
5. Upon receipt of properly completed application with required attachments, the sticker transfer will be recorded and a copy of the Approved application for transfer will be mailed to the property owner's address. Note, new stickers are not issued for transfer of registration.
6. Allow fifteen (15) days for processing and mailing. Contact Carolyn@dunlaplake.org with any questions or delays.

Notes:

1. A renter and/or lessee must include with the application a copy of the rental agreement or lease which verifies the owner has specifically transferred the right to own and operate boats on Dunlap Lake as part of the agreement with the renter or lessee.
2. Illinois requires the registration of all watercraft, including individual watercraft, unless specifically exempt. See Illinois Department of Natural Resources (DNR) website at <http://dnr.state.il.us/admin/boats.htm> for watercraft that are exempt. In most cases the exemption applies only to those watercraft properly registered with a Federal agency or another state, and only if operating in Illinois temporarily.
3. Individual watercraft are a specific class of watercraft defined in the amendment to the restrictions approved by the members on October 9, 2009.

The term "individual watercraft" shall mean any non-motor powered watercraft with a buoyancy capacity of less than 350 pounds and specifically designed to accommodate only one person.
